Fukimodoshi no Sato

Make your own party horns at a factory that makes approximately 80% of Japan's domestically produced party horns. The facility is barrier-free with workbenches set at wheelchair-friendly heights.

Ohama Park (Ohama Beach)

A sloping path has been built across the beach extending approximately 750 meters from north to south, making it accessible for wheelchair users to comfortably enjoy a leisurely stroll.

Awaji World Park Onokoro

Plenty of attractions that people of all ages can enjoy. Facilities include a multipurpose restroom equipped with a nursing bed, a nursing room, and a parent-child restroom.

A restaurant housed in a renovated brick factory built during the Taisho era. The barrier-free interior has a high ceiling with a spacious atmosphere.

Awaji Puppet Theatre

The theater performs Awaji Ningyo Joruri, a traditional puppet theater that has been passed down for approximately 500 years. If you opt not to participate in the backstage tour and remain in the auditorium, you can receive explanations from a member of the troupe while staying seated.
